

The Speech competition is designed to allow students the opportunity to gain speaking experience, as well as increase his/her confidence level in public speaking. Speeches may be one to two minutes in length. A club may have only one entry.

Time Limit: 1-2 Minutes

#### **Competition Guidelines**

- A typed bibliography with student name, student ID and grade must be submitted prior to speaking. If no sources are cited within the content of the speech, a typed bibliography stating "no sources needed" must be submitted.
- The speaker will receive a 5-point deduction for every 15 seconds that the speech is less than 1 minute or exceeds 2 minutes.
- Participants must be dressed in business attire. Props or costumes are not allowed.
- Random draw will determine the order of speech presentations.
- Spectators will be permitted based on room size.
- Use of electronic devices will not be permitted during competition.
